SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Mrs. Ruby Mae Weatherford (1889-1970) was a housewife who lived near Pendleton, Indiana, for many years. She supported Dwight D. Eisenhower during the 1952 and 1956 campaigns and prepared posters, poetry and articles of a political and patriotic nature, which she sent to the White House and various Republican officials.

This collection contains letters Mrs. Weatherford received from White House and Republican officials thanking her for her work. There is also a note to her family, written shortly before her death in 1970, in which she described the collection, and one of her posters, titled "America's Wheel for Peace and Progress."

In 2010, the library received a reproduction of a photograph of Ruby Mae Weatherford, Harvey Roger Weatherford, David Lawrence Weatherford, and Ira V.J.T. Weatherford (from left to right) taken by Howard P. Clanin at the Anderson, Indiana train station on Christmas Day, 1944.
