Dear Mr. President:

The enclosed billing is a copy of the first invoice mailed from the Tolls Office of the two Seaway entities.

The SIMCOE came in light, so the only charge was that against gross registered tonnage. This accounts for the small amount in dollars under our tariff schedule.

During the first three and one-half days, beginning April 25 after official opening, we transited through the Seaway 168 vessels, of which 67% were in ballast. Total billings were \$112,595.73.

I thought you might enjoy this document as an historic record, and possibly place it in the Abilene library.
