

SEATON, FRED A.: Papers  
Ivan Hinderaker Files

SCOPE AND CONTENT

Ivan Hinderaker was a political science professor who took a year's leave of absence from UCLA to work on Secretary Seaton's staff. A small series (about 500 pages) of his files was received with the Seaton papers. There are three distinct types of materials in this series. First is a folder of daily sheets with notations about Hinderaker's calls and appointment, August 19, 1959, to June 28, 1960. The second is a chronological series of carbon copies of letters written by Hinderaker from August 17, 1959, to June 28, 1960. It is mostly personal correspondence with his UCLA and political science contacts. A large portion of the letters have to do with the organization of the Citizenship Clearing House-Eagleton Foundation program whereby twenty-four young Democratic and Republican political science professors would attend their respective political conventions in the summer of 1960 and participate in seminars on the political process. The third segment of the file deals with Seaton's speeches, consisting of a calendar of engagements during Hinderaker's tenure and a subject file of quotation used by Seaton.
