JACKSON: Yes that west window [of the Eisenhower home] is the, well, she [Ida Eisenhower] had her piano in that room, but over in that west window she had a few flowers, but they had their reading material in that. And she had a, it seemed to me, a little rocker, I called it a sewing rocker, there by that west window. And then out this way from the house, northwest from the house, she had a bed of lilies. That's one thing I'm like her—I love lilies. She had this bed of lilies. She didn't have a lot of other—

BURG: Are they calla lilies?

JACKSON: No, no, they're Madonna lilies. They get up so high, and they're very fragrant.
