Mrs. Clara MacIntyre, widow of Malcolm MacIntyre, signed an instrument of gift for the papers on March 22, 1994. Literary rights in the unpublished writings of Malcolm A. MacIntyre in this collection and in all other collections of papers received by the United States have been donated to the public. Under terms of the instrument of gift, the following classes of items are withheld from research use:

1. Papers which constitute an invasion of personal privacy or a libel of a living person.
2. Papers which are required to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and are properly classified.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Malcolm A. MacIntyre (1908-1992) was born in Boston, Massachusetts. He attended Yale University and was a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University in England. After receiving his law degree he became a practicing attorney in New York City where he specialized in corporate law and performed legal services for American Airlines. During World War II he served in the Air Transport Command where he became acquainted with James H. Douglas. In 1957 Douglas, who was Secretary of the Air Force, invited MacIntyre to serve as Under Secretary of the Air Force. MacIntyre held the position for two years. In 1959 he resigned to become president of Eastern Air Lines. In 1964 he became executive vice president of Martin Marietta Corporation where he worked until he retired in 1973. MacIntyre was also active in civic affairs in his hometown of Scarsdale, New York, and served as mayor of Scarsdale from 1966 to 1969.

The papers of Malcolm MacIntyre pertain primarily to his work as Under Secretary of the Air Force and as President of Eastern Air Lines. There is also a small quantity of material on his activities in Scarsdale, New York, including his service as mayor. Most of the collection consists of printed material, memorabilia, and social correspondence. The information on his work in the Air Force is fragmentary and consists mostly of itineraries and publicity material he collected on inspection trips to U.S. air force bases around the world. Of particular importance is an oral history interview which the Air Force History Office conducted with MacIntyre in 1985, in which he gives general comments on various individuals and issues with which he was involved during his service as Under Secretary.

The files on his service with Eastern Air Lines are more extensive. These include copies of company publications, samples of advertising, and articles regarding his work for the company. A few items date from after he left the company, and contain retrospective comments on his work and his relationship with Edward Rickenbacker who was chairman of the board.
