The papers of C. Herschel Schooley, newspaper editor and government official, arrived at the Dwight D. Eisenhower Library in four shipments. Accession 76-7 was received in August 1975, A77-7 in November 1976, A77-7/1 in June 1977, and A78-9 in April 1977. An instrument of gift for these papers was executed in January 1977.

Literary property rights in the writings of C. Herschel Schooley in these papers and in other collections of papers in the Eisenhower Library are reserved to Mr. Schooley during his lifetime and thereafter to the people of the United States.

1. Papers relating to the family and private business affairs of C. Herschel Schooley.
2. Papers relating to the family and private business affairs of other persons who had correspondence with him.
3. Papers relating to investigations of individuals or to appointments and personnel matters.
4. Papers containing statements by or to C. Herschel Schooley in confidence unless in the judgment of the Director of the Dwight D. Eisenhower Library the reason for confidentiality no longer exists.
5. All other papers which contain information or statements that might be used to injure harass, or damage any living person.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers of C. Herschel Schooley span the years 1943 to 1961 when Mr. Schooley served as Public Information Officer with the U.S. Naval Reserve (1943-50) and as Director of the Office of Public Information for the Department of Defense (1953-58) and the Department of Interior (1958-61).

The bulk of Mr. Schooley's papers concern the period from 1953 to 1961 with the best documentation covering the years 1954 to 1958. As public information director, Mr. Schooley acted as a liaison officer between the Departments of Defense and Interior and the press. He formulated press releases, corresponded with newspaper editors, and reviewed the credentials of reporters.

The first series into which the papers are divided is Mr. Schooley's chronological file for the period from June 1954 to August 1957. This series consists of carbon copies of outgoing correspondence and memoranda and original copies of incoming letters. The material in this series arrived at the Eisenhower Library arranged chronologically by folder title. This order, and the titles on the original folders at the time of deposit in the Library, have been retained. Gaps exist in the chronology for the year 1957.

Documents in the chronological file deal with the day-to-day handling of press relations in the Department of Defense. Subjects included in the correspondence are accreditation of reporters, news coverage of defense projects, and Defense Department cooperation with television and movie productions.

The press conference series is divided into two subseries: Secretary Wilson and Secretary Seaton. This series, as well as the speech series, arrived at the Library arranged in chronological order by folder title. This order, and the titles on the original folders at the time of deposit in the Library, have been retained. The press conference and speech series consist of transcripts of and press releases concerning the news conferences of Secretaries Wilson and Seaton and the speeches of Secretary Seaton. The speech series also contains a report from July 1958 on an Interior Department conference concerning the Middle East oil situation.

The fourth series, which consists of a scrapbook, news clippings, a memoir written in 1975, and political cartoons, was unarranged at the time of deposit. The present arrangement and folder titles were provided by the archival staff of the Library. The naval base newspaper series was arranged chronologically at the time of deposit and this order has been retained. This series does not, however, contain a complete set of the newspaper's volumes.

A total of twenty-two photographs were removed and transferred to the audiovisual collection.
