SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

General Walter Bedell Smith entered the Indiana National Guard in 1910 and advanced through the ranks in the regular peacetime army to the rank of Colonel (temporary) at the outbreak of World War II. During the Second World War, General Smith's service as Chief of Staff to General Eisenhower in the African and European theaters is well known. After the end of the war, General Smith served in a variety of high military and civilian posts -- their being (in chronological order) the United States Ambassador to Moscow, Commanding General of the United States First Army, Director of the Central Intelligence Agency and Under-Secretary of State in the early years of the Eisenhower Administration. General Smith resigned from active governmental service in 1954, but continued to serve from time to time on several governmental boards and committees. General Smith died in 1961.

Although the papers in this file cover the varied positions held by General Smith and listed on the title page of this inventory, it should be noted that their subject content is primarily of a personal and/or social nature. His official papers reflecting service as Ambassador to Moscow (1946-49), Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (1950-53), and Under Secretary of State (1953-54) will not be found in this file. However, some correspondence of military and/or historical significance is located in folders bearing the titles: Correspondence (of Military and/or Historical Significance) (1)(2), and pieces of correspondence of particular interest may be found scattered through the correspondence portion of this file.

This file consists of correspondence, memoranda, reports, telegrams, speeches, newsclippings, pamphlets, booklets, vouchers, General Smith's deposition used in the Benton-McCarthy Case, and drafts and proof pages of portions of General Smith's two books, My Three Years in Moscow and Eisenhower's Six Great Decisions.

This file is comprised of five segments: the first consists of speeches, addresses and remarks of General Smith arranged chronologically; the second of miscellaneous materials reflecting the various occupations held by the General; the third of correspondence arranged chronologically by year and within that, alphabetically by name of correspondent; the fourth of General Smith's 201 file; and the fifth of First Army memoranda arranged chronologically. Attached to the copy of this preliminary inventory located in room 211 is a list of museum items which came to the Library prior to the arrival of the archival materials described in this inventory. These museum items originally were placed in the second stack level mezzanine and were subsequently removed and placed in the museum storage.

In addition to the papers described in this preliminary inventory, there are additional papers of General Smith in Accession No. A67-22 Papers of General Walter Bedell Smith, 1941-1945.
