JACKSON: I remember we [Dwight and Nettie] were washing dishes. What they used for a dining room now was the kitchen at that time. And they ate at a great big table right in the middle of the kitchen. He was washing dishes, and I was drying. And I remember he told me a riddle, and it's silly to remember it yet, but I do. He said, "There were two boys running a race, eating crackers, and one of them ate ninety-nine and the other ate a hundred and won. How many did they eat together?" Well, of course, you can't write that out, but I don't think I caught on till he told me. But oh, he was such fun to be around.
